Dates of Creation: 1884-1948

Biographical Sketch:

William Wilson was born on January 1, 1871 in Savona, B.C., the son of “Cattle King” John William Wilson and Mary Ann Cavanaugh. On September 30, 1898 he married Louise (Louisa) Gertrude Eagle in Kamloops, B.C., with whom he would have three daughters (May G., Elizabeth, and Agnes) and four sons (Charles William, Joseph Cecil, John, and Thomas James). After living in 150 Mile, the family settled in Westwold in 1906 after Wilson inherited ranching property there from his father. William Wilson died on May 29, 1950 in Westwold, B.C., at the age of 79 and was buried on the family property.

Louise (or Louisa) Gertrude Wilson (nee Eagle) was born on November 7, 1872, the daughter of Charles William Boromeo Eagle and Anna Tatqua. On September 30, 1898 he married Louise (Louisa) Gertrude Eagle in Kamloops, B.C., with whom she would have three daughters (May G., Elizabeth, and Agnes) and four sons (Charles William, Joseph Cecil, John, and Thomas James). After living in 150 Mile, the family settled in Westwold in 1906 after Wilson inherited ranching property there from his father. Louise was noted to be an excellent rider and hunter. Louise (or Louisa) Gertrude Wilson (nee Eagle) died on January 7, 1965 in Vernon, B.C. at the age of 42 and was buried in Falkland, B.C.

Scope and Content:

Fonds consists of family photographs (predominantly unidentified) and correspondence and accounts related to the family ranching property and Thomas Wilson’s fur trapping activity.
