Biographical Sketch:

Burton Roy Campbell was born in Manitoba in 1878. His family moved west during the 1880s, and Burt arrived in Kamloops in 1891. He worked at the Sentinel newspaper soon after his arrival in Kamloops, first as a delivery boy and later as an apprentice printer. In 1894 he left Kamloops for Vernon to work for the Vernon News before gaining employment with the Kootenay Mail in Revelstoke. In 1895 he had become a full printer for the newspaper and in 1897 he was a partner in the business. When he gained the age of majority in 1899 he became the sole owner of the newspaper, selling it in 1901 to try his hand in the insurance business before returning to Kamloops to work for the Kamloops Sentinel. In 1903 he married Annie Scott, and the couple returned to Revelstoke so that Burt could work for the Kootenay Mail again. They later moved to Vancouver, but returned to Vernon in 1907, settling for periods of time in Armstrong and Salmon Arm as well. In 1922 they returned to Kamloops and rejoined the Kamloops Sentinel. Besides his newspaper business Burt wrote and published many articles on the history of the Kamloops area, was on the board of the Royal Inland Hospital, and was a founding member of the Thompson Valley Museum and Historical Society (the precursor to the Kamloops Museum Association and current Kamloops Museum and Archives). Burt died in September 1955 in Kamloops, B.C. Burt and Annie had four daughters (Dora Isabella, Ida Alberta, Ruth Eileen, and Muriel Ethel) and three sons (Eldon David, Leslie V., and Roy Glen).

Scope and Content:

Fonds consists of ration books, receipts, and a ration book holder from Burton Roy Campbell's family during World War II, an educational book used by the family, and a postcard.
