Title: Clemes Family fonds

Dates of Creation: 1885-1958

Physical Description: 18 cm of textual records, 3 maps, and 9 b&w photographs

Biographical Sketch:

Arthur “Archie” Clemes was born in Cornwall, England on November 31, 1851, the son of William and Jane Clemes. The family emigrated to Canada, where they settled in Ontario. Clemes came to the Vancouver area during the 1870s, where he purchased numerous properties. He later settled in Spences Bridge around 1880 where he ran the Spences Bridge Light and Power Company, a grocery store, and the Spences Bridge Hotel. He also operated the B.C. Express Stables out of Nicomin Falls and owned a ranch in Westwold. Clemes was married twice, first to Esther, with whom he had two sons (Arthur Douglas and Frank Harold), and later to Rachel Oppenheim. Arthur Clemes died in February 1922.

William Seth Clemes was born on March 17, 1861, the son of William and Jane Clemes. After coming to Canada with his family as a young boy, Clemes would move to British Columbia and operate a ranch for his brother, Arthur, in Westwold. William Seth Clemes died in 1935.

Dorothy Anne “Dolly” Clemes was born on November 5, 1878 in Ontario, the daughter of William and Jane Clemes. On the death of her brother, Arthur Clemes, she took responsibility for much of his estate, including his ranch in Westwold. Dorothy Anne Clemes died on February 25, 1968 in Vernon, B.C. at the age of 89.

Frank Harold Clemes was born on August 14, 1911 in Vancouver, B.C., the son of Arthur and Esther Clemes. After growing up in the Vancouver and Victoria area, Clemes later moved to Spences Bridge. He was married to Agnes M. Calvin in 1935, with whom he had two daughters (Donna and Edna). In 1955 he moved to Kamloops, where he worked as a bus driver before opening his own trucking company. He later worked for the City of Kamloops. Frank Harold Clemes died on December 13, 1998 in Kamloops, B.C. at the age of 87.

The Spences Bridge Light and Power Company was established by Arthur Clemes in Spences Bridge, B.C., in 1912.

Scope and Content:

Fonds consists of correspondence, financial records, and legal documents of Arthur Clemes, William Seth (W.S.) Clemes, and Dorothy Clemes and records related to the Spences Bridge Light and Power Company. Fonds also includes a small amount of photographs.

Custodial History:

Fonds was donated to the Kamloops Museum and Archives on August 30, 1979 by Mrs. Dan Ambrosi (Edith Laura MacDougall) (accession 1979.053). Additional material was accrued to the fonds during reprocessing in 2023. Accessions 1993.012 and 1993.048 were donated on February 19, 1993 and an unknown date in 1993 (respectively) by Frank Clemes.
