Biographical Sketch:

(Edith) Kathleen (Kay) Dunsmore (nee Anthony) was born on April 1, 1903 in Lytton, B.C., the daughter of John Henry Anthony and Annie Gertrude Stevenson. She married Cooper Halford Dunsmore on September 7, 1929 in Vancouver, B.C. The couple settled in Kamloops, B.C. Kathleen Dunsmore (nee Anthony) died on January 5, 1985 in Kamloops, B.C. at the age of 81.

Scope and Content:

Fonds consists of materials collected by Kathleen Dunsmore, predominantly from her parents and her husband. Records include maps, photographs, publications related to pioneer history, church service programs, and various ephemera.

Custodial History:

All records were donated to the Kamloops Museum and Archives by Kathleen Dunsmore at various times: accession #1966.185 on September 26, 1966; accession #1966.210 on November 13, 1966; accession #1969.027 on March 13, 1969; accession #1970.045 on May 25, 1970; accession #1975.039 in June 1975; accession #1979.072 on November 13, 1979; accession #1980.021 on April 3, 1980; accession #1982.029 on April 29, 1982; accession #1983.006 on February 3, 1983; accession #1983.041 on June 30, 1983, per Mrs. Cavazzi; accession #1984.017 on March 1, 1984. Records were initially integrated into the Vertical Files collection (accessions #1966.185, 1966.210, 1969.027, 1979.072, 1982.029, 1983.006, and 1983.041), Map collection (accessions #1970.045 and 1975.039), and Photograph collection (accessions #1980.021 and 1984.017) based on format. Records were brought together as a distinct collection during reprocessing in 2021, with cross-references to the Map collection and Photograph collection maintained.

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Notes:

Source of supplied title: Title based on contents of fonds.

Arrangement: Collection has been arranged into three series based on the provenance of the records: Series 1: Family Records, originating from the collection of the donor's parents; Series 2: Cooper Dunsmore Records, originating from the collection of the donor's husband; and Series 3: Other Records, originating from the donor or having no provenance. Records within each series have been arranged chronologically based on their donation date, maintaining the original order wherever possible.

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Series 1: Family Records

1913-1923 — 2 textual records, 3 maps, and 1 b&w photograph

Scope and Content: Series contains records originating from the donor's parents: John Henry Anthony and Annie Gertrude Stevenson. Records include maps, pioneer history booklets, and a photograph.

Biographical Sketch:

John Henry Anthony was born on January 20, 1869. On June 26, 1902 he married Annie Gertrude Stevenson, with whom he had one daughter (Edith Kathleen) and two sons (Gerald Robert and Arthur Wallace). He worked as a merchant in Lytton, B.C. John Henry Anthony died on November 27, 1942 in Lytton, BC.

Annie Gertrude Anthony (nee Stevenson) was born on September 1, 1880 in B.C., the daughter of Arthur Stevenson and Agnes Caroline Laumeister. On June 26, 1902 she married John Henry Anthony, with whom she had one daughter (Edith Kathleen) and two sons (Gerald Robert and Arthur Wallace). Annie Gertrude Anthony (nee Stevenson) died on May 22, 1969 in Kamloops, BC at the age of 88.

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Series 2: Cooper Dunsmore Records

1914-1950 — 24 maps and 3 textual records

Scope and Content: Series contains records originating from the donor's husband: Cooper Dunsmore. Records include Dunsmore's military papers, maps, and ephemera.

Biographical Sketch:

Cooper Halford Dunsmore was born on November 15, 1886 in Stratford, Ontario, the son of John McArthur Dunsmore and Edith Gould Halford. By 1906 Dunsmore had moved to Saskatchewan, where he was engaged in homesteading. On September 7, 1929 he married Edith Kathleen Anthony in Vancouver, BC. The couple then settled in Kamloops. Cooper Halford Dunsmore died on April 28, 1975 in Kamloops, BC.
