Administrative History:

The Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen was founded as a labour organization (originally called the Brotherhood of Railroad Brakemen) for railroad employees in 1883 in Oneonta, New York with the purpose of negotiating contracts with railroad management and providing insurance for members. The organization represented conductors, conductor's assistants, dining car stewards, ticket collectors, baggagemen, brakemen, flagmen, yardmasters, yard conductors, switchtenders, foremen, flagmen, brakemen, switchmen, car tenders, operators, hump riders, and car operators. The first Canadian Lodge was formed in Moncton, New Brunswick in 1885. In 1969 the organization merged with three other unions (the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Enginemen, the Order of Railway Conductors and Brakemen, and the Switchmen's Union of North America) to form the United Transportation Union.

The Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen, Kamloops Lodge No. 519 was founded in 1895 as a trade union to represent railway workers in the Kamloops area. A Ladies' Auxiliary to the Lodge was also established, which hosted many social events.

Scope and Content:

Fonds consists of accounts journals, ledgers, correspondence, daybooks, record books, attendance registers, cashbooks, minutes, collective agreements, constitutions, and other records related to the Kamloops Lodge No. 519 of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen such as legislation related to the Workmen's Compensation Act, examination booklets, and train schedules.
