Biographical Sketch:

Gordon Sinclair Brown (often referred to as "Shindy") was the son of Alexander G. Brown and Carrie Cherry. He worked as a telegraph operator for the Canadian Pacific Railway in Albert Canyon.

Scope and Content:

Fonds consists largely of correspondence between Robert Roy Poole Brown (Gordon's brother) and Alexander G. Brown and photographs taken or collected by Gordon Sinclair Brown. Fonds also includes a small amount of ephemera collected by Brown including souvenir envelopes, and newspaper clippings and materials related to the death of Robert Roy Poole Brown.

Custodial History:

Accession 1976.003 was donated to the Kamloops Museum and Archives on February 5, 1976 by Gordon Brown via the Mission Historical Society. Materials were originally placed in the Vertical Files until processing in 2018. One photograph was removed from correspondence materials to facilitate preservation and numbered separately.

Accession 0.3594 was donated to the Kamloops Museum and Archives by Gordon Brown ca. February 1981. Materials were originally placed in the Kamloops 125th Anniversary Celebration Committee fonds (0.3594.002) and the Vertical Files (remainder) until processing in 2018. Item 0.3594.005 was removed from the collection and placed in the accessions case file, as it is correspondence from Gordon Brown regarding this donation.

Accession 1990.059 was donated to the Kamloops Museum and Archives by Connie Vicars at an unknown date ca. 1990. Photographs were noted to be from "Shindy" Brown (Gordon Brown), and were placed with this collection by the Archivist during processing in 2018.

Accession 2018.025 was donated on February 26, 2018 by Bart Vanderline, the husband of Gordon Sinclair Brown's granddaughter.

Accession 2018.234 was originally filed and numbered with accession 1990.059, but correspondence from Gordon Brown (which included a file listing specific to these photographs) and lack of mention of these materials in the accessions record for 1990.059 prompted the Archivist to reaccession them separately. Original item numbering has been retained, based on the file listing provided by Gordon Brown.
