Biographical Sketch:

Ida Alberta Conner nee Campbell was born in Vernon, the daughter of Burton R. Campbell and Annie Scott. She moved to Kamloops from Vernon in 1923 and was involved in various athletics associations. In 1937 she married Benjamin Earl Conner, a farmer from Heffley Creek, with whom she had a daughter (Arlene). Ida died in 1995.

Scope and Content:

Fonds consists of the personal papers of Ida Conner, which are comprised of school certificates, athletics association membership cards, greeting cards, photographs, picture postcards, and other papers. Fonds also includes a small number of school certificates for her husband, Benjamin Earl Conner.

Custodial History:

Fonds were donated to the Kamloops Museum and Archives in 1987 by the sister of Ida Conner.
