Administrative history:

The Friends of Kenna Cartwright Park is a non-profit society that was registered with the province of British Columbia in December, 1997. The society was established to provide support for Kenna Cartwright Park which is located in the Mt. Dufferin area of Kamloops. Among the society's official purposes are: to advocate for responsible recreational use of the Mt. Dufferin area; to advocate for minimum construction and development in the park; to promote and support environmental education for park users; and to encourage responsible decision making about the park by providing accurate information and studies. The society was spearheaded by its first president, Ron Hatch (1997-2002), with membership that includes residents of the Mt. Dufferin area, park users, Kamloops community members, University College of the Caribou professors, and a number of clubs with an interest in the area such as the Kamloops Naturalist Club, Sage Brush Orienteering, and the Kamloops Mountain Bike Association. Some of the activities of the Friends of Kenna Cartwright Park have included making formal presentations to city planning committees, conducting an inventory of park sites and surveying park users, publishing a society newsletter, fundraising, and organizing and carrying out park maintenance and restoration. In 1999 the society received federal funding through an EcoAction 2000 grant that enabled them to hire Catherine Tarasoff to serve as the park's restoration project coordinator. Her work at the park continued until March 2002, leading to the completion of an education and recreation report and a study of the park's bio-health. Ron Hatch stepped down from his position as president of the society in 2002.

Records include correspondence, reports, financial records, newsletters, meeting notices and minutes, plans, maps, a videocassette, and photographs.
