**Dates of creation:** 1930 – 2015

**Physical description:** 4.30 m of textual records and ca. 200 photographs

### Administrative history:

**The Kamloops Museum & Archives** was established in March 1936 as the Thompson Valley District Museum and Historical Association. The association's first president was J.J. Morse and M.L. Wade served as vice-president. The group's original mandate included both the collection of information relating to the history of the district and the preservation of any objects of interest for the purpose of a museum. The museum officially opened the following year on July 1, 1937, in an original Hudson's Bay Company log cabin salvaged by David Power and re-erected in Riverside Park (the log cabin is currently on the first floor of the museum). The association soon changed its name to the Kamloops Museum Association and by 1939 had expanded into the R.E. Smith house at Seymour Street and Second Avenue, where the museum occupied four rooms on the building's second floor. The building was donated to the city for use as a library and museum by Mrs. J.S. Burris, the daughter of Kamloops pioneer James McIntosh. The museum and archives initially grew from several formative collections, including photographs, bird and animal specimens, Indian artifacts, fur trade, gold rush, and pioneer materials. The photograph collection was largely comprised of some 700 photographs of Kamloops and the district compiled by Burt R. Campbell. By 1955, the photograph collection had grown to number over 3000 photographs. The bird and animal specimen collection was primarily made up of pieces from T.S. Keyes, a local taxidermist, and the Indian collection was largely comprised of artifacts collected by J.J. Morse, a teacher at Kamloops High School. In 1957 the Kamloops Museum & Archives moved into a new building funded by the city and built on the site of the Smith house at Seymour Street and Second Avenue. The building was initially shared with the Kamloops Public Library until 1978 and then the Kamloops Art Gallery until 1998, at which point the museum took over all three floors of the building. In 1966 the museum operated a second site in Riverside Park in a replica Hudson's Bay Company fort. The second facility was run as the Ranch Museum until it closed in 1981 and the bulk of the ranching machinery and artifacts collection was transferred to the Historic Hat Creek Ranch. The museum and archives were initially run by volunteers and local heritage enthusiasts. The first full time employee of the museum, Mary Balf, was hired in 1966 after having served for several years

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as a volunteer. She was the face of the museum for much of the next 15 years until she retired in 1980. During her tenure she served as curator and archivist, produced numerous articles and pamphlets on local history, presided over major indexing projects in the archives, and served a term as the president of the BC Museums Association. Following Mary Balf, the museum and archives was headed by Ken Favrholt from 1980 to 1989 and Elisabeth Duckworth from 1990 to 2013. The current Museum Supervisor, Julia Cyr, started in 2013. The Kamloops Museum Association was dissolved in 2007 and the administration of the Kamloops Museum & Archives was fully transferred to the City of Kamloops.

### **Custodial history:**

The majority of the records in the fonds were held in the archival storage area in several bankers-boxes and two filing cabinets. The records do not seem to have been organized as a whole prior to their processing by the archivist in 2014. The catalogue books for instance were held in the archives reading room within a cabinet that also held microfilm and oral histories. Most of the KMA presidents' files and the Mary Balf files were kept by the museum in a bankers-box labelled KMA, but the files of J.J. Clark, Alex Finley, and Wilf Schmidt were acquired separately through donations. The writings and notes series consists of records previously held as three unaccessioned collections in the archives: J.J. Morse historical notes, Mary Balf writings, and Kamloops 1914-1945 research notes. The correspondence series consists of museum and archives correspondence that was removed from the archives' subject and biographical files and the Native studies and Hudson's Bay Company collections. The correspondence was previously filed by subject or individual. During processing the archivist removed the correspondence from these files and replaced the originals in most instances with copies. The correspondence is, however, still filed alphabetically, retaining the original file titles of the various subject files and biographical files.

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### Scope and content:

Fonds consists of administrative records of the Kamloops Museum & Archives spanning the years 1930 to 2014. The fonds documents the operations of the museum and archives from its creation in 1937 to the present. Records include minutes, annual reports, correspondence, financial records, registry books, photographs, clippings, and catalogue books. The fonds has been arranged in to the following 14 series:
