Biographical sketch:

Charles Lee Jr. was born on August 31, 1916 at Ashcroft, British Columbia, the son of Charles Lee, who is thought to have been the first Chinese child born in Kamloops, and Jessie Hing, who belonged to one of the earliest Chinese pioneer families in B.C. Charles Lee Jr. was active throughout his life with various community service groups, including the Prince George and Kamloops Central Lions Club, the Kamloops Fish and Game Club, the United Way, Kamloops Rockhounds, the Canadian National Institute for the Blind, and the Royal Canadian Air Force Association. He married Laura Chow in ca. 1943 and they lived for a period during the 1940s in Hamilton, Ontario, before returning to B.C. He died in Kamloops on October 28, 1990 at age 74.

Scope and content

Fonds consists of a small amount of material related to Charles Lee Jr., son of Kamloops Chinese pioneers, Charles Lee Sr. and Jessie Lee. The fonds includes approximately 170 family photographs, many taken in Kamloops and Hamilton, Ontario, with views of Lee family and friends. The majority of the photographs, however, are unidentified. Also included are 2 letters addressed to Charles Lee Jr. and his wife Laura Lee; blank stationery with the letterheads of four Chinese associations in Kamloops; and, a single handwritten Chinese-language document on Chinese Patriotic Association letterhead.

Custodial history

Records in this fonds were acquired from a garage sale in North Kamloops by Karen Grauer on August 30, 2003. The individual holding the garage sale had likely obtained the records from a garbage bin outside of Whitmore's Second-Hand Store in Kamloops when the store went out of business. Karen and Peter Grauer donated the records to the Kamloops Museum and Archives on September 15, 2003.

Additional information relating to these records was gathered on August 28, 2019 by Elsie Cheung, George Cheug, Joe Leong, and Richard Lee (the brother of Charles Lee Jr.), and was added to the fonds during reprocessing in 2019.
