Biographical Sketch:

Donald A. McKenzie (“Stub”) was born on October 6, 1884 in Renfrew, Ontario, the son of Donald McKenzie. McKenzie was an employee of the Canadian National Railways from 1904 to 1952, acting as a locomotive engineer and rising to the rank of Senior Employee in Train Service West of the Great Lakes. He was married to Flora McKenzie, with whom he had at least one child (Donald James).

Scope and Content:

Fonds consists of the personal papers of Donald A. McKenzie largely relating to his career for the Canadian National Railways. Fonds includes photographs, a newspaper clippings scrapbook and additional clippings, correspondence, social event programs, and other ephemera.

Custodial History:

Accession 1998.022 was donated to the Kamloops Museum and Archives by G.B. Gillett, after coming into his possession from Donald James McKenzie, the son of Donald A. McKenzie.
