Biographical Sketch:

Robert George Pinchbeck was born on October 11, 1885 in Williams Lake, B.C., the son of William Pinchbeck and Alice Elizabeth Kilham (later Ratchford). Pinchbeck came to Kamloops in 1895 when his mother remarried, along with the rest of his siblings. In 1906 Pinchbeck joined the established painting business Blackbourn Bros, and established his career as a painting contractor. He married Edith Maria Currie on September 22, 1909, with whom he had one daughter. The couple briefly moved to the Cariboo, but returned to Kamloops in 1918 and Pinchbeck began working for the Fire Department. This career change would only last a year, though, as Pinchbeck is noted to have established a painting business on the coast. By 1923 Pinchbeck has returned to Kamloops, and was plying his trade as a painter in his own firm in partnership with his brother, Cyril Joseph Brook: Pinchbeck and Pinchbeck. . Pinchbeck would remain in Kamloops for the rest of his career, becoming involved in various city enterprises and organizations. He would serve as the Police Commissioner (1926, 1927, 1931, 1933, 1935), President of the Fish and Game Association (1928, 1929, 1932, 1933), President of the Conservation Association (1929), President of the Legion Symphony Orchestra (1936), and head of the Kamloops Museum (1951), and was actively involved with the A.F. & A.M. Robert George Pinchbeck died on April 16, 1956 in Kamloops, B.C. at the age of 70.

Scope and Content:

Fonds consists of various ephemera collected by R.G. Pinchbeck including invitations to social events, programmes, and magazines.
