#### Biographical Sketch:

**Dr. Raymond Reeves Robinson** was born in Christchurch, New Zealand on July 7, 1937. He studied medicine at the University of Ontago Medical School and psychiatry in London, England, before moving to Kamloops in 1971. Dr. Robinson worked in Kamloops at the Irving Clinic, Aberdeen Medical Centre, and the Royal Inland Hospital and was active in the community at St. Andrews Presbyterian Church. Dr. Robinson died in Kamloops on November 30, 2002.

#### **Scope and Content:**

Fonds consists of a collection of photographic slides, taken by Dr. Ray Robinson and his wife Joy Robinson. Images depict Kamloops and the surrounding area from the 1970s to the 1990s.
